About the Program

The Library/Information Technology Program trains students to assist in the management of information in libraries and other venues using print, multi-media and digital resources. The program is designed to educate students to respond to the changing needs of information management in our society.

While emphasizing technical skills and information researching and gathering competencies, our program also highly values interpersonal skills. As often as possible we incorporate practical, on-site experiences into our curriculum.

The skills, attitudes, and knowledge learned through the Library/Information Technology Program are ones that have broad applications in a variety of workplace settings.

Online Courses

The required core LIBT courses for both our A.S. Degree and Certificate are offered online; many of the electives are also available online.

Library/Information Technology A.S. Degree

Students may pursue an Associate in Science Degree in Library/Information Technology by completing the required 29.5 program units, and the college general education requirements for a total of 60 units. Or, students may elect to complete the 26.5 required units for the Certificate of Achievement (see separate brochure).
